

## **2026 GEO Secretariat Budget**

*As approved at the GEO-21 Plenary.*

### **1 INTRODUCTION**

The GEO Secretariat Budget supports the operations of the GEO Secretariat, which plays an essential role coordinating and facilitating GEO activities, engaging diverse stakeholders, advocating for recognition of the importance and value of Earth observations, communicating about the successes and activities of the GEO Work Programme (GWP), negotiating in-kind contributions to the GWP, and facilitating cooperation amongst organizations throughout the GEO community.

The Budget is designed to allocate the Secretariat's financial resources in order that it can best support future delivery on the GEO Post 2025 Strategy and the associated GEO Strategy Implementation Plan.

The 2026 GEO Secretariat Budget comes at a time of uncertainty relating to over 25% of the GEO Secretariat's funding. The role of GEO Members in stepping up to resource the operations of the Secretariat is more critical than ever.

Remaining staff costs under the Work Programme Unit are funded 20% by the iClimateAction project.

## 4 UNFUNDED ACTIVITIES

This section represents GEO activities that cannot be resourced under the current estimated contribution level found in Section 2.

GEO-YOUTH is a dynamic network of 250+ young professionals from 40+ countries, driving Goal 4 of the Post-2025 Strategy by engaging youth in Earth Intelligence. To scale this impact, the Secretariat proposes a mentorship programme with GWP initiatives, related internships within the GEO Secretariat, and a dedicated Secretariat staff role for coordination.
